To: MALCOLM EATON Enterprises benefit participants who are Medicare eligible

Re: Medicare Part D Drug Plan - Creditable Coverage

This letter along with the attached Notice of Creditable Coverage is to inform you that MALCOLM EATON *Enterprises* Drug Plan (PPO) does qualify as creditable coverage. This means you do **not** have to purchase one of the Medicare Part D Drug Plans to protect yourself against the late enrollment penalty if you are or your participating dependent is:

- Over 65 and eligible for Medicare
- Disabled and eligible for Medicare
- Have/has end stage renal disease and is eligible for Medicare
- You are on COBRA and eligible for Medicare, or
- If you enter one of the above categories in the near future

For example, if you work until age 70 and then you purchase your Medicare Part D Drug Plan, you will not be required to pay the late enrollment penalty because our Group Drug Plan meets the creditable coverage requirement.

Please read and keep the enclosed Notice of Creditable Coverage with your files. **You will be required to provide proof of your creditable coverage if you choose to purchase a Medicare Part D Drug Plan in the future.** This letter and the attached Notice of Creditable Coverage mean that you do **not** have to do anything at this time with regard to the Medicare Part D Drug Plan; you can continue as you have in the past.

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## **Important Notice from Malcolm Eaton Enterprises About Your Prescription Drug Coverage and Medicare**

Please read this notice carefully and keep it where you can find it. This notice has information about your current prescription drug coverage with Malcolm Eaton Enterprises and about your options under Medicare's prescription drug coverage. This information can help you decide whether or not you want to join a Medicare drug plan. If you are considering joining, you should compare your current coverage, including which drugs are covered at what cost, with the coverage and costs of the plans offering Medicare prescription drug coverage in your area. Information about where you can get help to make decisions about your prescription drug coverage is at the end of this notice.

There are two important things you need to know about your current coverage and Medicare's prescription drug coverage:

1. Medicare prescription drug coverage became available in 2006 to everyone with Medicare. You can get this coverage if you join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or join a Medicare Advantage Plan (like an HMO or PPO) that offers prescription drug coverage. All Medicare drug plans provide at least a standard level of coverage set by Medicare. Some plans may also offer more coverage for a higher monthly premium.
2. Malcolm Eaton Enterprises has determined that the prescription drug coverage offered by the United Health Care, Outpatient Prescription Drug, Illinois 10/35/70 Plan 01 is, on average for all plan participants, expected to pay out as much as standard Medicare prescription drug coverage pays and is therefore considered Creditable Coverage. Because your existing coverage is Creditable Coverage, you can keep this coverage and not pay a higher premium (a penalty) if you later decide to join a Medicare drug plan.

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### **When Can You Join A Medicare Drug Plan?**

You can join a Medicare drug plan when you first become eligible for Medicare and each year from October 15<sup>th</sup> to December 7<sup>th</sup>.

However, if you lose your current creditable prescription drug coverage, through no fault of your own, you will also be eligible for a two (2) month Special Enrollment Period (SEP) to join a Medicare drug plan.

## **What Happens To Your Current Coverage If You Decide to Join A Medicare Drug Plan?**

If you decide to join a Medicare drug plan, your current Malcolm Eaton Enterprises coverage will be affected. See attached United Health Care Benefit Summary, Outpatient Prescription Drug, Illinois, 10/35/70 Plan 01.

If you do decide to join a Medicare drug plan and drop your current Malcolm Eaton Enterprises coverage, be aware that you and your dependents will be able to get this coverage back.

## **When Will You Pay A Higher Premium (Penalty) To Join A Medicare Drug Plan?**

You should also know that if you drop or lose your current coverage with Malcolm Eaton Enterprises and don't join a Medicare drug plan within 63 continuous days after your current coverage ends, you may pay a higher premium (a penalty) to join a Medicare drug plan later.

If you go 63 continuous days or longer without creditable prescription drug coverage, your monthly premium may go up by at least 1% of the Medicare base beneficiary premium per month for every month that you did not have that coverage. For example, if you go nineteen months without creditable coverage, your premium may consistently be at least 19% higher than the Medicare base beneficiary premium. You may have to pay this higher premium (a penalty) as long as you have Medicare prescription drug coverage. In addition, you may have to wait until the following October to join.
