

GreenState CU Funds Repairs

Representatives from GreenState Credit Union presented Malcolm Eaton Enterprises with a check for \$20,000 on Wednesday, October 9. The money is being used to replace the roof on a newly acquired residential CILA home. CILAs, or Community Integrated Living Arrangements, are residential facilities that provide 24-hour supervision and support for adults with developmental disabilities.

The home is currently being renovated and is scheduled to open in Spring of 2025. Once open, the facility will provide 24-hour care to 5-6 clients.

These funds are provided by GreenState Credit Union, which seeks to improve the quality of life in the communities that they serve.
